CALL FOR APPLICATION **ERASMUS+ STUDENT MOBILITY FOR INTERNSHIPS**

WHAT is funded?

- Erasmus+ funds internships (compulsory, optional, and voluntary research or industrial internships) of at least two full months up to a total of twelve months per study cycle (Bachelor, Master, PhD).
 - Students can complete several internships at different locations as long as the minimum duration of 2 full months without interruption at a host institution in one location is completed and the total duration of 12 months per study cycle is not exceeded.
 - A minimum of 3 ECTS per month must be achieved.
- Graduate internship:
 - Graduates who have been accepted for an internship after graduation are eligible to participate.
 - The application for Erasmus+ funding must be submitted to the International Office at least 3 months before graduation.
 - Participants must not be enrolled at any university, university of applied sciences during the internship.
 - The mobility period must be at least 2 full continuous months to a maximum of 12 full continuous months. The mobility must be completed 12 months after graduation.
- All mobilities funded by Erasmus+ are added to the maximum duration of 12 months per study cycle.

WHEN is the application deadline?

- Applications can be submitted at any time, but must be submitted at least 3 months before the stay.
- The grant cannot be awarded retroactively.

WHO can apply for the grant?

- All active PMU students in the Bachelor's, Master's, and PhD programs.
- Students receiving the Studienbeihilfe can also apply for Erasmus+ funding.
- Students with special needs can apply for additional funding (see p. 3).

What is NOT eligible for funding?

- Mobility in Austria
- Mobility in Nuremberg Campus, at the Nuremberg Clinic and/or SALK
- Mobility in the institutions of the European Commission
- Mobility in the country of residence during studies

For non-Austrian students:

- Mobility in the home city or region is **not** eligible for funding.
- Mobility in the country of origin has the lowest priority in the allocation of funds. This means that the approval of funding depends on the available budget.

WHERE can mobility take place?

- In industry (e.g. companies, organizations, research institutions, hospitals, clinics, etc.) or at a higher education institution with a valid Erasmus Charter in the 26 EU Member States including their overseas countries and territories, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, the Republic of North Macedonia, Serbia and Turkey.

Mobility outside the EU:

- Mobility to the UK, Switzerland and other countries outside the EU is only possible to a very limited extent and depends on the available budget (approx. 2 places per year).

HOW does the application process work?

WHY is mobility important?

- A stay abroad supports the acquisition of social, professional and methodological skills, as well as the development of global citizenship, the establishment of international networks, and the broadening of horizons.

NEW from academic year 2024: Travel expenses: All Erasmus+ students receive a one-time travel grant, which is calculated as a lump sum based on the distance between Campus Salzburg / Campus Nuremberg and destination. The distance band is calculated according to the distance calculator.

As a general rule, participants traveling less than 500 km should use environmentally friendly low-emission means of transport (e.g. bicycle, bus, 2nd class train or carpool if 2 or more PMU students are travelling to the same internship location).

Environmentally friendly travel grant only applies if more than half of the journey is made by a lower-emission means of transport. Proofs (copies of tickets) are required.

Additional top-ups (a separate application is required)

- **Top-up for students with fewer opportunities:** grant of **EUR 250** per month for participants
 - with a physical impairment/disability
 - with a chronic illness, if the illness results in increased financial expenditure during the stay abroad
 - Participants who take their children with them during their stay abroad.

Inclusion support (if needed):

- Erasmus+ covers additional costs incurred by participants with fewer opportunities (who already receive the top-up for fewer opportunities) during the stay abroad and which cannot be covered by the top-up.

- Inclusion support is based on real costs.
- Participants must submit a separate application to the Austrian National Agency via the International Office of the PMU.
