CALL FOR APPLICATION **ERASMUS+ SHORT-TERM MOBILITY FOR STUDENTS**

WHAT is funded?

- Erasmus+ funds short-term mobilities with a minimum duration of 5 to a maximum of 30 consecutive days at a host institution for students in Bachelor's, Master's and PhD study cycles.
- Students can complete several stays at different host institutions as long as the minimum duration of at least 5 to a maximum of 30 consecutive days per host institution is completed and the total duration of 12 months per study cycle is not exceeded.

For Bachelor's and Master's students:

- A virtual component is mandatory, e.g. online learning as part of a course or a Blended Intensive Program (BIP) at the host institution.
- A minimum of 3 ECTS credits must be earned, recognized, and credited by the degree program.

For PhD students:

- Virtual component is optional.
- Short-term mobility for study or internship purposes.

For all students:

- All mobilities funded by Erasmus+ are added to the maximum duration of 12 months per study cycle.

WHEN is the application deadline?

- Applications can be submitted at any time, but must be submitted at least 3 months before the stay.
- The grant cannot be awarded retroactively.

WHO can apply for the grant?

- All active PMU students in the Bachelor's, Master's and PhD programs.
- Students receiving the Studienbeihilfe can apply for Erasmus+ funding.
- Students with special needs can apply for additional funding (see p. 3).

WHERE can the mobility take place?

For PhD students:

- For internship purposes: in industry (e.g. companies, organizations, research institutions, hospitals, clinics, etc.) or at a university with a valid Erasmus Charter.

For all students:

- In higher education institutions with a valid ECHE in the 26 EU member states including their overseas countries and territories, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, the Republic of North Macedonia, Serbia and Turkey.
- The basic requirement for a mobility is a valid Erasmus+ Inter-Institutional Agreement (IIA) between the host university and the PMU.

Mobility outside the EU:

- Mobility to the UK, Switzerland and other countries outside the EU is only possible to a very limited extent and depends on the available budget (approx. 2 places per year).

What is NOT eligible for funding?

- Mobility in Austria
- Mobility in Nuremberg Campus, at the Nuremberg Clinic and/or SALK
- Mobility in the institutions of the European Commission
- Mobility in the country of residence during studies

For non-Austrian students:

- Mobility in the home city or region is **not** eligible for funding.
- Mobility in the country of origin has the lowest priority in the allocation of funds. This means that the approval of funding depends on the available budget

WHY is mobility important?

- A stay abroad supports the acquisition of social, professional and methodological skills, as well as the development of global citizenship, the establishment of international networks, and the broadening of horizons.

ERASMUS+ grant amounts for short-term mobility 2024/2025

Duration of the mobility	Grant amount per day and participant
up to 14 days	€ 79,00
from the 15th to the 30th day	€ 56,00

NEW from academic year 2024: Travel expenses: All Erasmus+ students receive a one-time travel grant, which is calculated as a lump sum based on the distance between Campus Salzburg / Campus Nuremberg and destination. The distance band is calculated according to the distance calculator.

As a general rule, participants traveling less than 500 km should use environmentally friendly low-emission means of transport (e.g. bicycle, bus, 2nd class train or carpool if 2 or more PMU students are travelling to the same internship location).

Environmentally friendly travel grant only applies if more than half of the journey is made by a lower-emission means of transport. Proofs (copies of tickets) are required.

Additional top-ups (a separate application is required)

- Top up for students with fewer opportunities for participants who:
 - have physical disabilities or impairments
 - have chronic illness, if the illness results in increased financial expenses in the destination or receiving country
 - must take their children with them during the mobility.

Duration of the mobility	One-time top-up for students with fewer opportunities
Up to 14 days	€ 100,00
15th to 30th day	€ 150,00

Inclusion support (if needed):

- Erasmus+ covers additional costs incurred by participants with fewer opportunities (who already receive the top-up for fewer opportunities) during the stay abroad and which cannot be covered by the top-up.
- Inclusion support is based on real costs.
- Participants must submit a separate application to the Austrian National Agency via the International Office of the PMU.
